"All the kings horses and all the king's men couldn't put Humpty together again." – Verse from Humpty Dumpty

But what all the king's horses and all the king's men can't do, God can.

In Step 7 we humbly ask God to remove our shortcomings.

We don't have to resolve to do better only to fail again and feel worse than before. We aren't strong enough to fix ourselves, in spite of our promises.

"I know that nothing good lives in me, in my sinful nature. I have the desire to do what is good, but I can't carry it out. The good I want to do I don't do and the evil I don't want to do – this I keep doing."

PAUL, ROMANS 7:18-19

God gets us in Christ, and his power is available – a power greater than ourselves that can restore us.

How do we get things like fear, pride, greed, lust and anger removed from our lives? Where can we go for deeper-than-cosmetic surgery?

- 1. The Bible says we go to the cross of Jesus Christ.
- 2. He forever loosened sin's death grip on us. He was there to set us free.

Our defects and shortcomings needed forgiveness and our sinful nature needed to be nullified.

In Christ's death, God dealt with both the source and symptoms of our problem.

Deal with the source or the mopping up – from our sins, our defects, our junk – will never end.

Jesus gets all my sins; they are gone. My sin debt has been legally transferred to him. Now it's paid in full.

Step 7: Jesus has everything I need, so I ask God to help

"Away with this man (Jesus). Release Barabbas to us."

Jesus died in Barabbas' place, just as He died in our place.

For life change, we need to do what the thief on the cross did.

1. Admit Your Powerlessness

"We (thief on the cross) are punished justly...getting what our deeds deserve." (Luke 23:41)

2. Treat Jesus like a Divine Rescuer

"Remember me when you come into your kingdom." (Luke 23:42)

3. Surrender Yourself to Jesus

Jesus, remember me; don't forget me. I have nowhere else to go, no one else to turn to. God, I'm willing that you should have all of me – good and bad. Remove every single character defect that stands in the way.
